### **Private study description**

Students are expected to do the majority of their work for this module outside seminars. Class time will be devoted to introducing new concepts via reading, vocabulary and grammar work. Students are advised that they should reckon on spending an average of at least 2 hours of private study between each class and will also need to spend some time during vacations to consolidate material in preparation for an exam on the first day of the next term. Independent learning will typically involve:

- · written exercises set on topics introduced in the session
- vocabulary acquisition learning new endings and sentence structures
- · consolidation of recent material
