#### Introductory description

This is a compulsory course for third year students in the joint and Law and Business Studies degree programme co-taught by the Warwick Law School and the Warwick Business School. It is not open to other students.

#### Module aims

The course aims to introduce students to the legal, social and economic factors affecting businesses competing in the global marketplace.

Throughout the course, students will be encouraged to develop research, analytical and presentation skills and demonstrate the ability to integrate different fields of knowledge in the analysis of legal and business issues. On completion of the course, students should be able to apply and to critique the legal rules relating to global business. You should also be able to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of both the legal and economic issues surrounding the establishment and financing of multinational business operations, including the impact of multinational business on employees, customers, communities and the environment.
