Introductory description

This module includes a 4-week placement which renders students' degree professionally relevant, enabling students to develop real world employability skills and apply data analysis skills in a non-academic setting.

Module aims

To enable students to:

- Undertake a 4-week work placement;
- Prepare for consultancy work in quantitative analysis during their placement;
- Reflecting on the transferable and disciplinary skills gained on the placement, and applying the learning back into the discipline in their third year work;
- Gain a practical experience of working with numerical data in the workplace and appreciate their role.

Outline syllabus

This is an indicative module outline only to give an indication of the sort of topics that may be covered. Actual sessions held may differ.

Workshops (introduction, CV design, statistical software, poster design) before and after the placement.

4-week placement.
