Description

Introductory description

This intermediate year module builds on the first-year ab-initio French language module in the French Studies section of the School of Modern Languages and Cultures. It will develop students' language acquisition in French, extend their linguistic skills through translation, writing, reading, speaking and listening activities. The module will prepare them for final-year study. The module will further develop students' awareness of French and Francophone culture.

Module aims

- to work towards B2+ standard of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference);
- to enable students to develop language learning strategies;
- to develop the four key skills: reading, listening, speaking and writing.
- to understand ideas in complex text, and produce text on a wide range of topics;
- to hone and develop translation, writing and grammar skills, register awareness and vocabulary acquisition, both general and specialised.

Outline syllabus

This is an indicative module outline only to give an indication of the sort of topics that may be covered. Actual sessions held may differ.

Communicative skills: Listening, speaking as well as reading and writing activities will be supported by a variety of authentic written and spoken material focusing on aspects of life and culture in French-speaking countries in addition to topical issues.

We will cover items such as : Origins/family/social relations, Employment, Consumer society, the French language, Media and the news, the Environment, France and the French, Travel and Adventure, Health + Fitness, the Arts, Technology, Tomorrow's world.

Grammar - We will cover items such as: present, perfect, imperfect, future, conditional, pluperfect and conditional perfect, the subjunctive, adverbs, comparatives and superlatives, object pronouns, demonstrative and emphatic pronouns, relative pronouns, making a hypothetical statement, conjunctions to develop oral and written skills.

Learning outcomes

By the end of the module, students should be able to:

- apply knowledge of grammar appropriate to the level
- understand the main ideas and some detail of complex texts on concrete and abstract topics
- interact with fluency and spontaneity, and account for and sustain viewpoints
- write clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects; explain viewpoints on topical issues
- develop strategies to communicate some information coherently and effectively to a specific audience

International

This module develops intercultural awareness and helps to prepare students for international student mobility.

Subject specific skills

- Strategies for understanding gist and specific information
- Strategies to communicate effectively both in writing and orally in French
- Intercultural competence

Transferable skills

- Communication skills: writing and oral presentation, defending one's point of view
- Intellectual skills: critical thinking, analysis
- Organisational skills: independent work, time management
- Interpersonal skills: flexibility, adaptability and the ability to work with others
- Digital skills: online tools, online collaboration
