# Introductory description

This module is the equivalent of a level 6 module in Spanish at the Language Centre.

This module is designed to help students achieve a high level of language proficiency in Spanish and to maximise their experience of the language. It is structured around viewing and discussing feature-length films in Spanish to foster a better understanding of Latin American and Spanish societies and to explore contemporary issues and the linguistic variants portrayed in the films.

Prior knowledge of Spanish required:

- -successful completion of Spanish Language Centre level 5
- -a B2.2 level of the CEFR (Common European Framework of reference for Languages)
- -a good A level or equivalent + 1 year of further study
- -or equivalent

Successful completion of Film qualifies students to progress to Spanish language through Translation.

- -to develop listening skills by being exposed to a variety of accents/registers/contexts from the Spanish- speaking world at native speed.

# Learning outcomes

- Demonstrate an extended lexical, grammatical and syntactical knowledge of Spanish.

- Identify, synthesize and present in Spanish core and complex arguments developed in films, texts and discussions.
- Demonstrate a higher degree of intercultural awareness such as the changing social environment and the cultural and linguistic diversity in the Spanish-speaking world.
