Description

Introductory description

Supply Chains operate in a world that is volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous (VUCA). This therefore requires Supply Chains to adapt to this context. This can require transformation of Supply Chains to varying different degrees.

This module will explore the full spectrum of different types of Supply Chain Transformation and implications for business model and Supply Chain design. It will also consider the role of change management in enabling transformation.

Module aims

To provide a framework with supporting models, tools, examples of leading practice to enable the consideration of transformative approaches to business model and supply chain design, both within and beyond the bounds of the programme.

Outline syllabus

This is an indicative module outline only to give an indication of the sort of topics that may be covered. Actual sessions held may differ.

Implementing Supply Chain Improvement (six month Supply Chain Improvement Project with supporting implementation clinics), What is Transformation?, Types of Supply Chain Transformation, Business Models and Supply Chains, Leading Supply Chain Transformation, Design for Supply Chain Transformation, Future Pacing, Personal Networks.

Learning outcomes

By the end of the module, students should be able to:

- Appraise and apply leading business models and supply chain practices and evaluate their relevance in a company context
- Evaluate transformative practice and associated potential pathways for implementation
- Critically discuss and evaluate leading practice both within and beyond the context of a company and consider how these can be effectively shared and embedded within an organisation
- Recommend mechanisms for ensuring personal supply chain practice remains contemporary and refreshed, and can influence change
- Critically reflect on personal practice as a leader in the supply chain, and how personal practice enables or inhibits supply chain performance

Presentation 20% 10 hours

20 minute presentation with 10 minutes Q&A, critically appraising the implementation of a specific supply chain improvement in the Supply Chain Design module
