Description

Introductory description

Social Studies provides a foundation of knowledge, understanding and skills that can be applied to a wide variety of professional areas. These areas include Social Work, Counselling, Coaching, Mentoring, Early Years and Teaching (compulsory and compulsory). This module facilitates the focussed exploration of one such chosen professional area.

Module aims

The module aims to:

1. Frame and facilitate a learner-led critical study of a chosen social studies-related professional area
2. Facilitate the development of knowledge, understanding and skills relating to the chosen professional area
3. Encourage a critical reflection of how prior learning relates to the chosen professional area
4. Encourage a critical analysis of how wider social studies-related topics relate to the chosen professional area

Outline syllabus

Sessions 1 to 24 = learner-led seminars/workshops, guest speakers and/or scheduled 1:1 tutor meetings

- Evaluate contemporary policy and ethics frameworks and requirements related to the professional area

In a live poster presentation, students present a poster which examines one contemporary issue relating to their chosen professional field. Students should draw upon theory to support arguments made.
