Description

Introductory description

The module will facilitate students' self-awareness of strengths and weaknesses in order to improve their learning skills.

The module is designed to enable students who have demonstrated higher linguistic skills to fast-track two levels, (levels 3 and 4), in one year instead of two.

The module will strengthen reading and writing skills and will also reinforce the communicative skills acquired during previous study of the Italian language. Students will gain further insights into the culture and civilisation of Italian-speaking countries. The module will offer a more advanced study of language structure and syntax, and will concentrate on using the target language for discussing and analysing aspects of Italian and society.

Prior knowledge of Italian required:

- A2 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of Reference)
- or a high grade in GCSE or equivalent
- or equivalent in International Baccalaureate
- or Language Centre Italian beginners accelerated
- or equivalent

Successful completion of Italian Intermediate Accelerated qualifies students to progress to Italian 5/Advanced.

Module aims

To understand ideas in complex text, and produce text on a wide range of topics.

To facilitate students' self-awareness of strengths and weaknesses in order to improve their learning skills.

To work towards B2 of the CEFR (Common European Framework of reference).

Outline syllabus

This is an indicative module outline only to give an indication of the sort of topics that may be covered. Actual sessions held may differ.

Communicative skills

This module will cover items such as: giving advice; describing anecdotes in the past; expressing commands; making promises; expressing wishes; talking about hypothesis; making predictions; giving opinions; justifying actions; expressing agreement and disagreement.

Grammar

This module will cover items such as: the past tenses (passato prossimo, imperfetto, trapassato prossimo, passato remoto), the future tense, the conditional, direct and indirect object pronouns, the subjunctive.

This syllabus is for indicative purposes only and will be updated regularly to remain relevant.

- Apply knowledge of grammar appropriate to the level.
- Understand the main ideas and some detail of complex texts on concrete and abstract topics.
- Interact with fluency and spontaneity, and account for and sustain viewpoints.
- Write clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects; explain viewpoints on topical issues.
- Demonstrate self-awareness of strengths and weaknesses in order to improve learning skills.
