Particular emphasis is placed on developing the skills required to write persuasive undergraduate essays: referencing, paraphrasing, summarising, planning, structuring, critical reading and critical writing. Students will continue to develop their academic writing style throughout their degree, but it's important to lay some solid foundations at the start - and this is the main focus of this module.
